Bitcoin: A Peer to Peer Electronic Cash System

It all started on October 31st 2008, when Satoshi Nakamoto, an anonymous coder, released the bitcoin whitepaper in a cypherpunk mailing list. Since 2009 we have had magic internet money - Bitcoin, with no banks, no government and no middle man. The embodiment of economic freedom from traditional financial institutions, a radical new way to exchange value across the world. Freedom to trade with anyone, anywhere, at any time.

Bitcoin (BTC) and Bitcoin Cash (BCH)

Like gold, Bitcoin has a limited supply, capped at 21 million. With a predictable supply and being the first mover, Bitcoin becomes popular among investors and trading platforms. However, that also ends at an expensive means to transact.

Bitcoin Cash(BCH) is a different story. In August 2017, some miners and developers initiated a hard fork, effectively creating a new currency: BCH. BCH has its own blockchain and specifications, including one very important distinction from bitcoin: BCH has implemented an increased block size of 8MB (eventually raised to 32MB) to accelerate the verification process, with an adjustable level of difficulty to ensure the chain's survival and transaction verification speed, regardless of the number of miners supporting it. BCH is truly the way to keep the P2P currency alive.
